PRESENTATION (F-L-P): Fish-Location-Presentation (Thank you Al Linder & In Fisherman Magazine)

F = Knowledge of your target species

L = Knowledge of the location you are fishing

P = Bait presentation in a manner and location your target species will see it and strike it

- ✓ Keep in touch with your fly. Have a good grip on your tight fly line and a low rod tip when fly hits the water
- ✓ A tight line is your best strike indicator. Watch where it enters the water for a quick stop, straightening or twitch.
- ✓ Surface retrieves vary from still to pop and stop and strip and rip. Consider a slow strip with a rod top wiggle with floaters.
- ✓ Fast retrieve to trigger strike from aggressive surface or schooling fish...hug the structure (woodpecking & bushwhacking)
- ✓ Slow glide vs. hop n drop is often a more productive approach for deeper or bottom feeding fish
- ✓ Casts parallel to the bank will keep your fly in the strike zone longer regardless of depth.

<u>FLY ROD</u> 8.5 – 10', 3 to 10 Weight depending on species, location and presentation (size/weight of fish and fly)

FLY LINE Weight Forward Floating; Sink Tip, Sinking (weight matched to fly rod)

Surface Floating Line: Topwater (baitfish, insect, frog, snake, mouse)

Near Surface Floating Line: Swimmer (baitfish, insect, frog)

Top 10': Floating/Sink Tip: Diver/Weighted (baitfish, insect, frog, crayfish, leech)
Below 10' SinkTip/Sinking Line Unweighted/Weighed (baitfish, insect, crayfish, leech)

LEADER Surface and Near (9' 5x – 0x); Subsurface (6' 3x-0x); Fluorocarbon (20>15>12.>10); Wire (Knot 2 kinky)

<u>LOCATION</u> <u>Concentrate on Structure & Transition Zones with food (bait):</u> Target Windy Shorlines; Edges & Ledges, Points &

Drop-Offs, Humps & Saddles, Weedbeds, Creekbeds & Roadbeds, Rockpiles, & Brushpiles, Warm flats in Spring,

Deep Water in Summer; Go "Woodpecking, Bushwacking and Rockhopping".

Structure is wood, rock, vegetation, shade, bridge pilings, bottom transitions; depth transitions, temperature changes

- ✓ Larger Size Flies, i.e. size 2 -14 are recommended for warm water species
- ✓ Wire leaders are recommended for targeting northern pike and muskellunge. Larger flies are available for these species.
- ✓ Weedless presentations are recommended when targeting any species in bush, grass, weeds or wood.

KAYAK RIGGED & READY:

- ✓ Rig for safety, fish finding and successful bait presentation.
- ✓ Wear A Personal Flotation Vest
- ✓ Anchor rode (bow eye and retrieving cord) in forward gear bag
- ✓ Stowed Gear Bag (first aid, sunscreen, cell phone, license, water, sunglasses, brush anchor, flashlight, waterproof matches)
- ✓ Safety Line for rods and paddle
- ✓ Tie downs for gear/cooler
- ✓ Wheels for transport
- ✓ Fish finder/Battery box secured/ transducer secured
- ✓ Chartplotter/Fishfinder on board: Find the structure...Fish Arch Clusters and "Christmas Trees"...not individual blips
